Mayor Eastman called the meeting to order at 6:38 p.m.; roll call was taken with Councilors Gary Ventress, Angel Vanderwilt, and Joy Porter present. Roll call was followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Mayor Eastman discussed accounts payable and the documents of items that will be paid. Councilor Ventress motioned to pay the October bills, second by Councilor Vanderwilt, followed by a roll call vote with Councilors Ventress, Vanderwilt, and Porter voting aye - motion passed. Councilor Porter voiced concern about receiving the account payables late and Mayor Eastman clarified Councilor Porter had received the documents earlier.

Mayor Eastman explained that Chris Robison had moved out of Spirit Lake and the City will need a new Council person.


The Park and Rec report was given by Director Laura Zimmerman. Two more soccer games, dance class full (32 registered), basketball sign-ups, and potential Winterfest dates in January.

The Police report was given by Chief Sanchez. Chief Sanchez shared the exterior painting of the police department is complete. SLPD employees and reserves volunteered their time to complete the project. SLPD participating in two patrol enforcements; drinking and driving and underage drinking, and instead of declining, calls have remained steady. SLPD has increased patrol presence in school zones and crosswalks. SLPD was audited by the Idaho State Police Bureau of Criminal Identification to ensure compliance of rules, protocols, and procedures for processing arrests and accuracy in reporting to the state. SLPD passed the audit. Officer Salisbury attended active shooter/school shooter training and officers attended a suicide prevention 5k walk/run. On September 28th SLPD participated in a "Child Seat Safety Check" in partnership with Kootenai Health and gave out 7 car seats. Coffee with a Cop on October 2, 2018 went well. Chief Sanchez informed Council that that SLPD is preparing for "Holidays & Heroes" and in the past Council has approved a \$500 donation and respectfully requested the donation be considered for this year.


Mayor Eastman and Councilors discussed the resignation of Chris Robinson and if the Councilors need to act upon or accept the resignation publicly.

No questions from Council about Public Works.

Mayor Eastman adjourned the meeting at 7:00 p.m.
